



Setting Java security settings for LAMUS

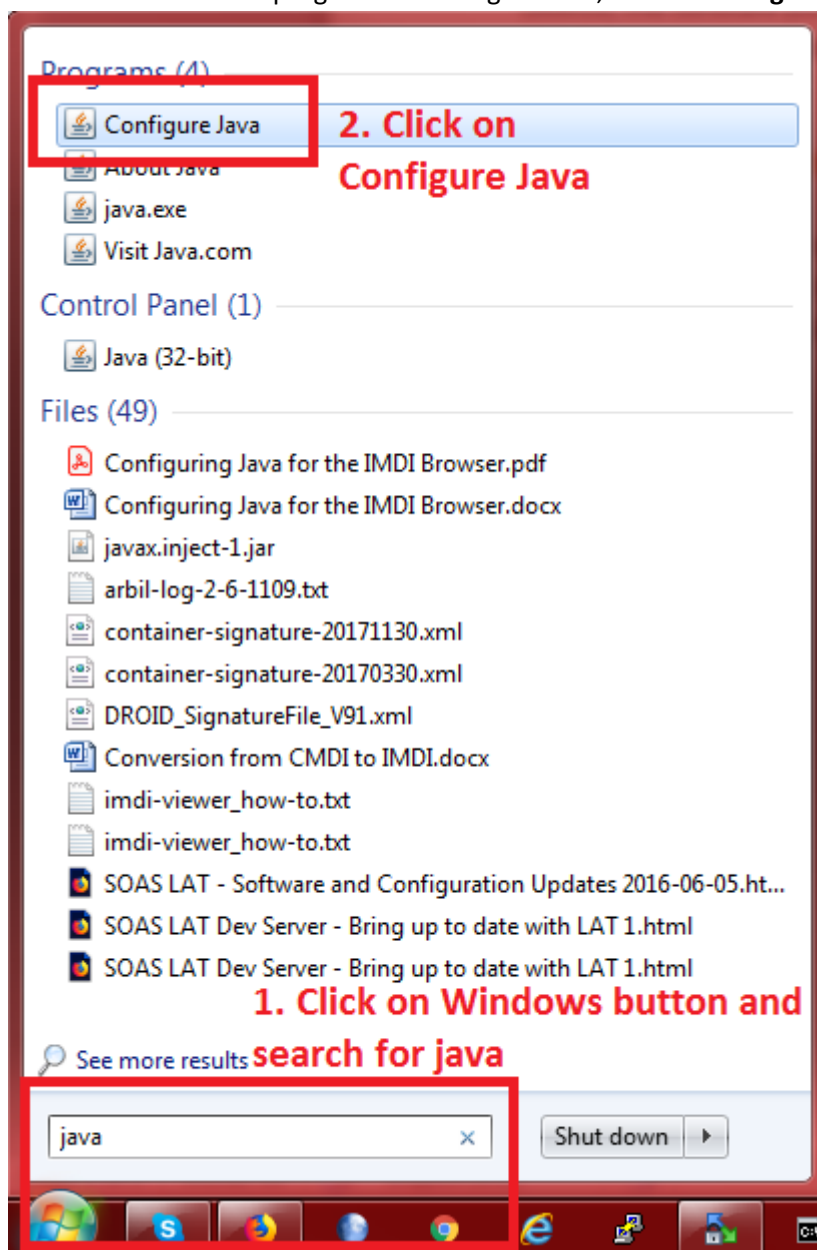

Background

LAMUS, the software you use to upload data to the archive, requires the Java security settings to list our archive as an exception to the usual blocking of Java. This document describes how to do this.

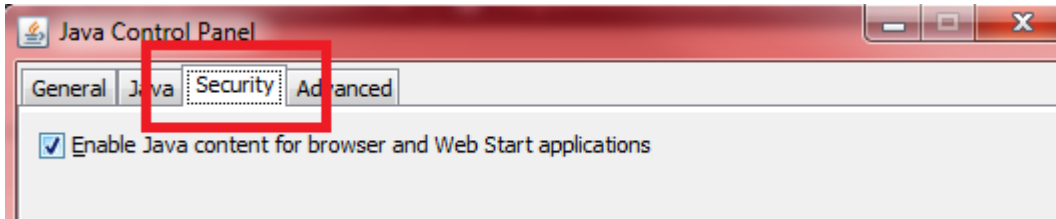
Java security configurations under Windows

1. Click on the Windows Start button in the bottom left corner of the screen and type “java” in the search box. In the programmes that get listed, click on **Configure Java**.

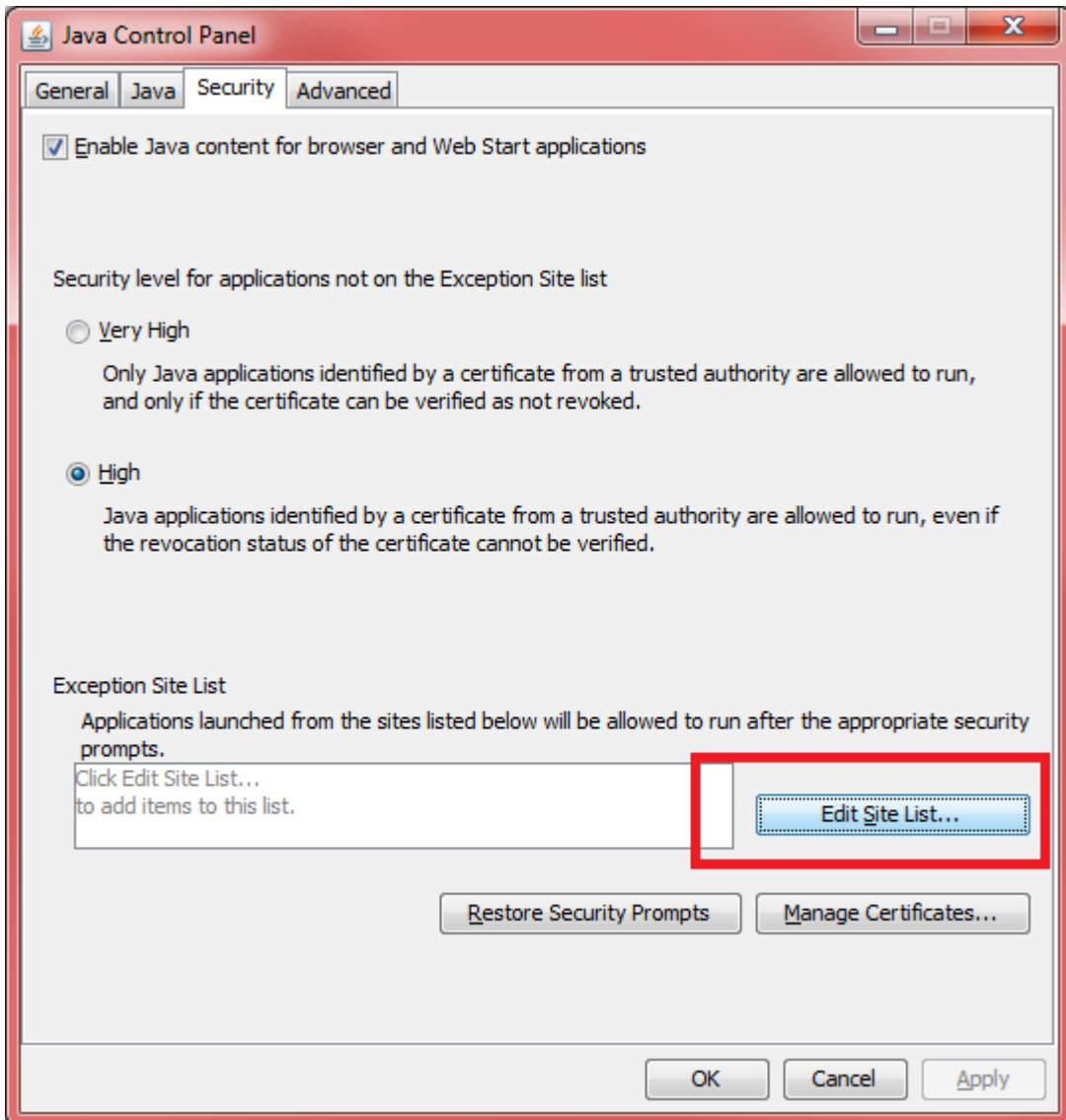




2. In the Java Security Panel window that opens, click on the **Security tab**.

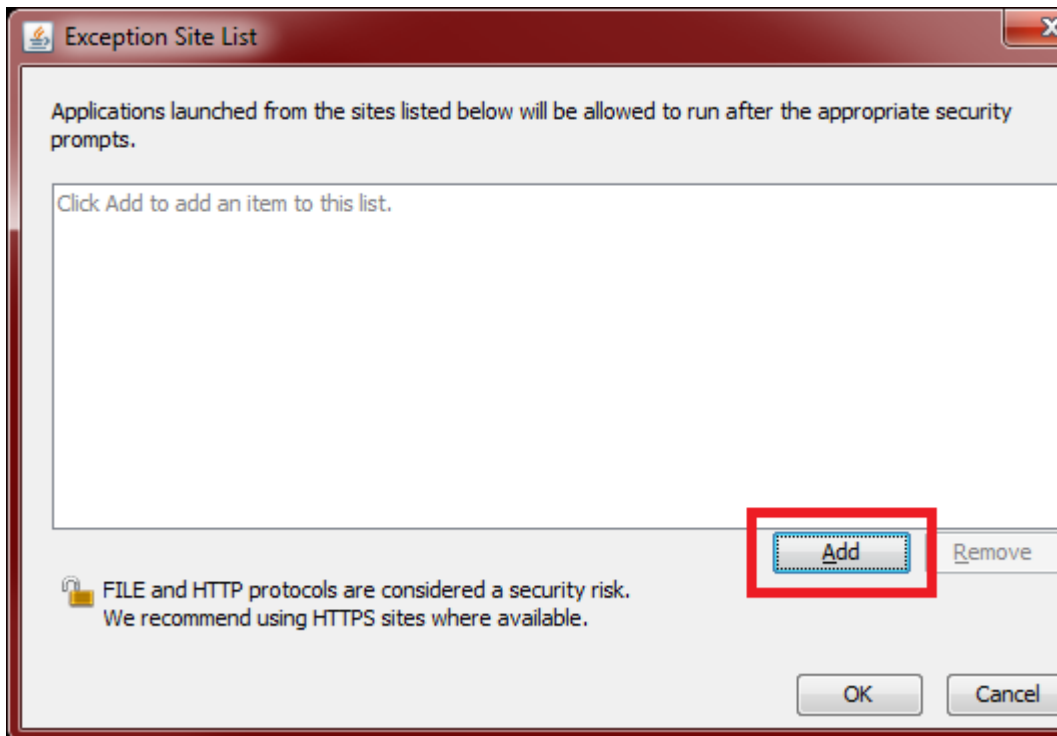


3. Click on the **Edit Site List... button**.

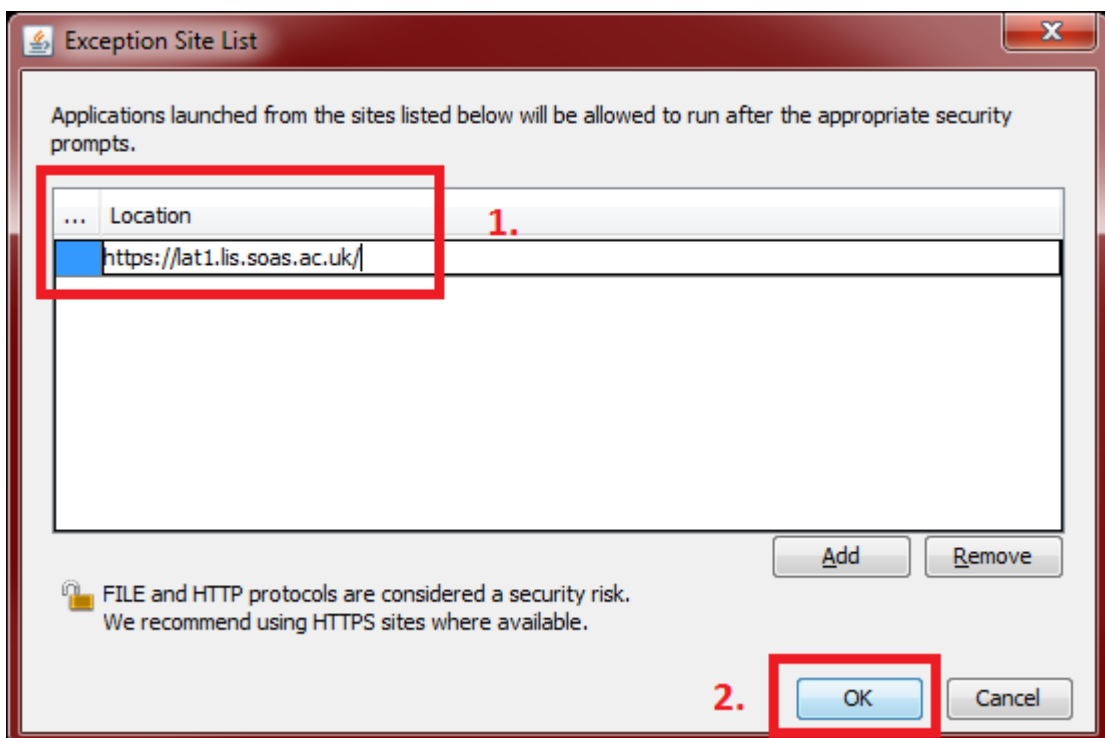




4. In the Exception Site List that opens, click on the **Add button**.

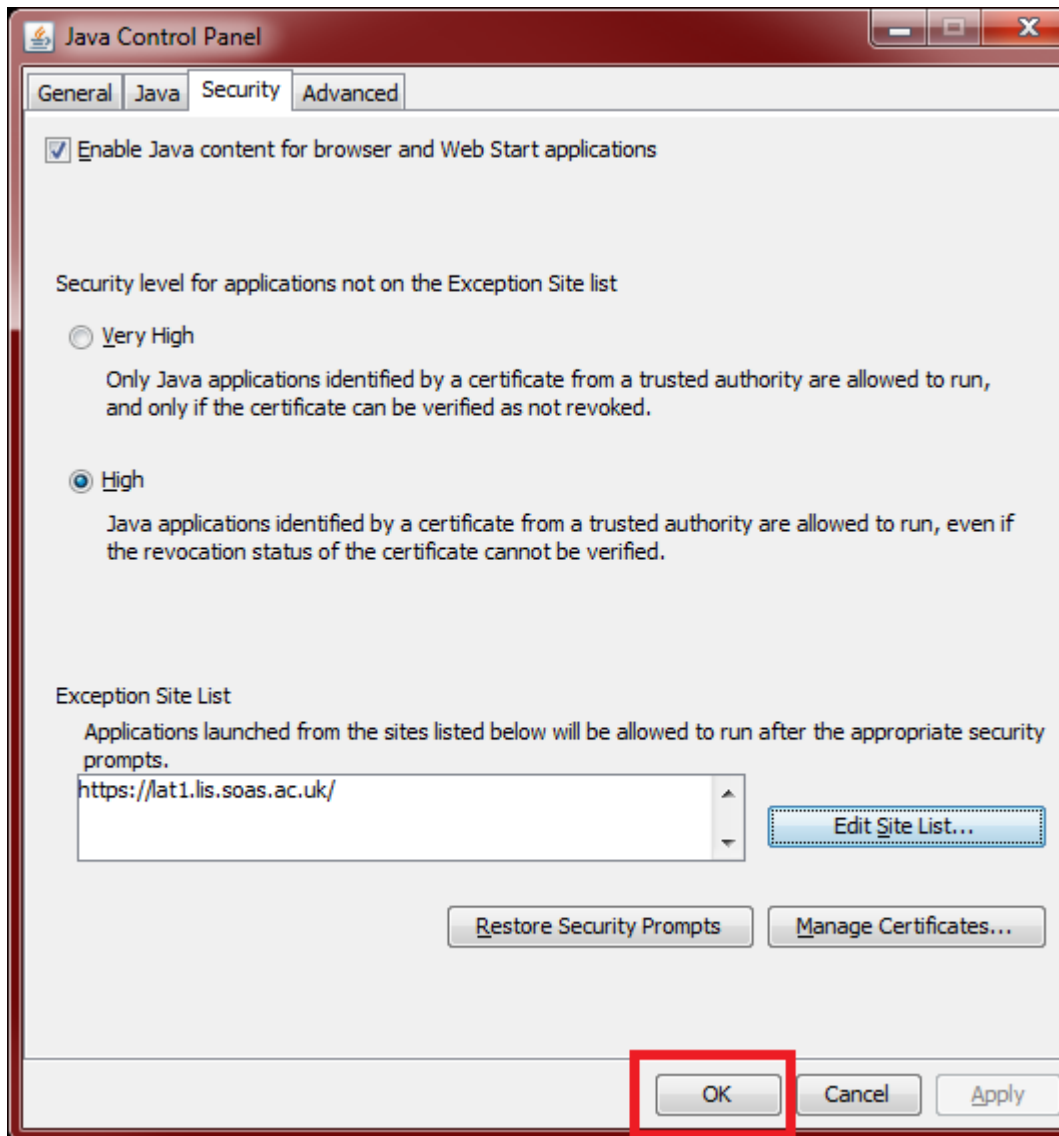


5. Copy and paste the following link into the location box: <https://lat1.lis.soas.ac.uk/>. Then click on the **OK** button.





6. You return to the Java Control Panel. Click the OK button here too.



7. Restart Pale Moon¹, the internet browser we use for LAMUS. LAMUS should be running now.
