

First Panel: How developing countries get to net zero in a financeable and affordable way

New estimates by the African Development Bank suggest that the continent's infrastructure needs amount to \$130-170 billion a year, with a financing gap in the range of \$68-\$108 billion. Institutional investors such as insurance companies, pension funds, and sovereign wealth funds could help fill Africa's financing gap

Join us as we look into Africa's potential to industrialize and reach net zero emissions, the prospect of financiers financing non-green businesses, and the environmental consequences, particularly in terms of social licenses.

Second Panel: Governments' role in accelerating Africa's green economy transition

In Africa, fossil fuel subsidies account for an average of 3.8 per cent of GDP, and as high as 5.8% in Algeria. Global fossil-fuel subsidy outlays fell to a 14-year low of \$180 billion in 2020, according to the International Energy Agency's energy subsidy tracker.

This session seeks to invite leaders of government to explore carbon taxes and emissions trading in a portfolio of policies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and various governments' positions on the more traditional energy sources such as coal, LNG, and oil.
