Have your classmates chosen the same one as you?

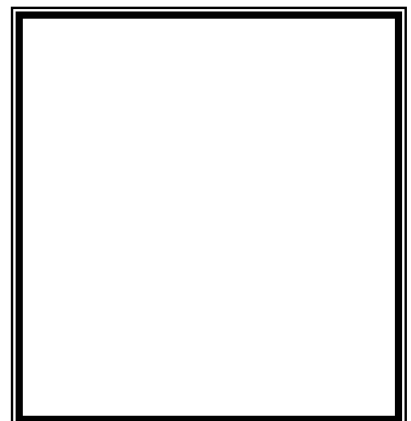
Can you find a crescent moon in one of the paintings?

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Second Room, Ground Floor

Find a horse. Do you think the horse is happy? Why?

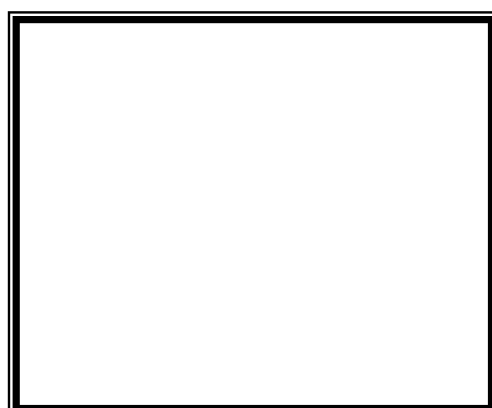
Find three musical instruments. Which one do you like best?
