

The SOAS Journal of Postgraduate Research recently standardised a set of rights and regulations that all prospective authors should review and be aware of if they consider submitting an article to the Journal. Further action may be required, such as seeking permissions for written or photographic materials used, and authors should secure these within the timeframe defined by the Journal for each publication year.

Please note that these rights and regulations were introduced by the Editorial team leading the Journal in 2016-2017 and are liable to changes as new Editors take over.

Acknowledgements and Plagiarism

Authors should acknowledge clearly all authors they extract ideas and quotations from to avoid plagiarism. Please be advised that the Journal uses Turnitin to check for plagiarism. If papers are found to include plagiarised content, they will be excluded from the review process directly. If such discovery is made post-publication, the articles will be automatically retrieved and the author will not be allowed to resubmit material for review to the Journal.

Permissions

Authors should own the copyright for all materials they use in their articles, or they must obtain the appropriate permissions for materials that are owned by others. In the latter case, authors must provide evidence of permissions obtained at the time of their final submission of the revised article. This regulation applies to both written and photographic material.

Publishing Rights

The SOAS Journal of Postgraduate Research publishes all articles under a CC-BY-NC 4.0 International Licence.¹ This means that the authors retain full copyright over their work, but give the Journal permission to publish it. It also means that authors' work can be used with attribution for anything publicly, but not for resale. In other words, the work cannot be reused commercially without an author's permission. Authors who plan to publish similar content in future publications should be aware that publication in the SOAS Journal of Postgraduate Research may constitute previous publication and authors should seek advice from their supervisors if they have any doubts about their publication strategies.
